*Judging for the 2007 Alaska State Fair Homebrew Competition will not be sanctioned by the American Homebrewers Association. Competition will be judged using the AHA competition descriptors and definitions along with the five scoring categories. Judges may be AHA certified or simply "Man off the street" with a palate for good homebrewed beer. All decisions are final.*

Entrants may only submit one entry per subcategory. For categories that have no subcategories, (Categories 20, 23, 29) you may only submit one entry. Judges may not judge a category they have entered.

Submit three bottles (10 to 22 ounces) per entry for beers, sparkling meads and ciders. Still mead or cider entries can submit one large 22 ounce/750 ml) bottle or three 10 to 12 ounce bottles.

Every bottle must be free of paper labels or other markings. Obliterate any lettering or graphics on the cap with a permanent black marker. Please accompany entries with the recipe to assist judging process.

All mead and cider entries must be designated dry, semi-sweet, sweet and sparking, petillant, or still. All mead entries must indicate mead strength as hydromel (light mead), standard mead, or sack mead (strong mead).

If you enter Category 6D, 16E, 17F, 20, 21, 22B, 22C, 23, 25C, 26A, 26C, 27E, 28B, 28C, 28D, or 29; please provide the style and/or unique ingredients or processes. This information is necessary for accurate judging of entries in these categories.
