Trimmed: Roots and/or stems pared and cut to reasonable length.

Cleaned: No visible soil on leaves, stems or roots.

Wrapper leaves: Leaves closest to head with a curled edge. **With Stems**: Neatly trimmed to 1", unless stated otherwise.
