- ❖ All entries must be grown by exhibitor unless otherwise noted.
- ❖ Refer to “Judging Criteria” and “Definitions” for guidelines. Judging is on market quality.
- ❖ All entries, become the Fair’s property, except Herbal Window Boxes, Garden Displays, and Pumpkins.
- ❖ Produce is donated to various Community Services, the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center and the Alaska Zoo.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- Division 01-09, 12-17: Market quality, clean, undamaged, uniformity, size, trueness to type and color.
- Division 10 - 11: Clean, undamaged, weight or length. Over matured/bolted entries will not be accepted.

- Division 10, Cabbages Only (green & red)

Divisions are open to ages 6 and above.

- Age consideration for Juniors (ages 6 to 17) is given only in:
 - Divisions 02, 03, 07, 09, 11, 12, 15, 16 & 17.
 - Junior age must be stated on entry form.
- Potato Parade is open to ages 5 and under only.

DEFINITIONS

- **Bunch:** Tied market bunch, 1"-2" in diameter for radishes, beet, endive, mustard, spinach, and turnip greens. Tied market bunch, 2"-5" for broccoli, chard, collard greens and kale.
- **Topped:** Removed evenly to within ½" or as listed per Class guidelines.
- **Trimmed:** Roots and/or stems pared and cut to reasonable length.
- **Cleaned:** No visible soil on leaves, stems, or roots.
- **Wrapper leaves:** Leaves closest to head with a curled edge.
- **With Stems:** Neatly trimmed to ½" - 3", as per Division & Class guidelines.

- ❖ Entrant supplies container of choice, e.g. basket, pot, vase, or bowl.
- ❖ Container dimensions should not exceed 16" in any direction. No artificial plant material allowed.

Creative Crops Arrangement Judging Criteria:

- Arrangement/creativity - 40 points
- Overall quality and condition - 35 points
- Number of items adequately displayed - 15 points
- Educational value/correct names - 10 points

- ❖ Signage welcome
- ❖ Assembly complete by 6 pm on entry day
- ❖ Removal 1st entry display on September 1st (8 am – noon)
- ❖ Removal 2nd entry display on September 8th (connect with superintendent for time)
